Paraprofessional Education K-12

Students can complete the Paraprofessional Education K-12 program using one or more of the following delivery formats: traditional on-campus classes, online classes, and/or interactive video classes. Through online instruction, students can enroll and complete the program from any location.

DCB students have the option of taking classes collaboratively from other campuses in the ND University System, giving them many courses from which to select. DCB administers the registration, financial aid, billing, and transcripts for students using this option.

Why study paraprofessional education?

DCB's paraprofessional education K-12 major prepares students for employment as teacher aides in elementary and secondary schools. Para educators are often responsible for supervising children, leading small groups, producing instructional materials, and assisting in lesson delivery.

Career choices

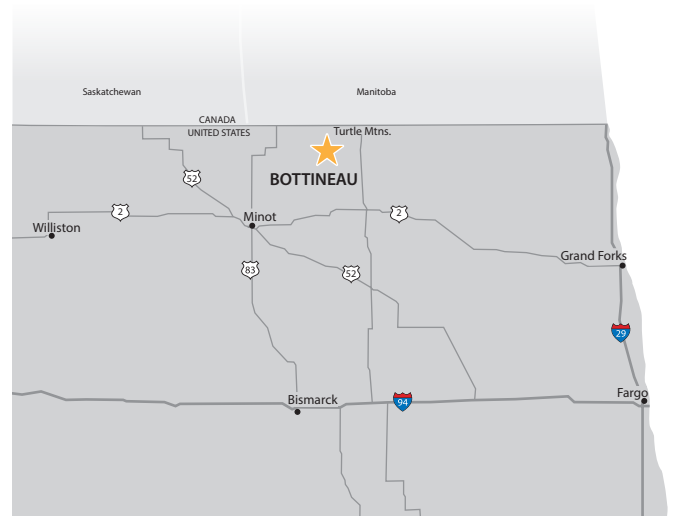
