Urban Forest Management

The urban forest management major is designed for students looking for a career working in the tree care industry. Students will learn tree identification, proper tree care, disease management, pruning techniques, safe work practices, along with essential urban forest management and communication skills. Professionals in the urban forestry field can work in a variety of settings. If you are interested in government agencies, many hire urban foresters in municipal settings. There are also opportunities to run your own tree care business.

Why study urban forestry?

An Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in Urban Forest Management helps to prepare you for the urban forestry career path by gaining knowledge in urban forestry management. Beyond this you will learn how to care for a variety of tree species.

Career choices

Graduates typically are employed by municipal forestry departments, parks and recreation departments, or as commercial arborists. Urban forestry jobs may include, but are not limited to:

- Tree care foreman
- Municipal arborist
- Forest inspector
- Land use planner
- · Nursery manager or vegetation planner
- · Consultant for urban forest management and tree care

Focused courses for this degree

This program focuses on urban forestry courses specifically and includes fewer of the general education courses requires in an AAS degree. You will study urban forestry management, urban trees and shrubs, and arboricultural practices.


