First Year Experience is Required

First Year Experience is a one credit class that all first-year students are required to take. You are graded on your participation, so you should expect to attend every session. There is essential information at each session and helpful staff here for the explicit purpose of preparing you for your first semester on campus. Failure to attend key elements of First Year Experience may mean you will be required to attend another session before being advised and registering for classes. This will also be your first grade on your official college transcript.

Immunization Records

MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella)

The North Dakota State Board of Higher Education requires that all students born after 1956 provide documentation of two (2) doses of Measles, Mumps and Rubella administered no less than one month apart, or provide documentation of titers proving immunity to each disease.

Meningococcal (Students 21 and younger)

Effective Fall 2017, newly admitted students ages 21 and younger must provide documentation of immunity against Meningococcal disease in accordance with this policy. The Chancellor shall adopt procedures implementing these requirements. Documentation of immunity under subsection 2 in SBHE Policy 506.1 means evidence of at least one dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine at age 16 or older.

DCB accepts copies of records issued by physician offices, local health departments, high schools, colleges, or military records.

Placement Testing

All students who have not taken the ACT or SAT will need to take a placement test when arriving to campus. Placement testing will take place in the computer labs on Monday, August 26 from 8:00 am to 10:00 am, or call 701-228-5657 to schedule an appointment for your placement test.

Financial Aid and FAFSA

To be considered for financial aid you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and include the DCB school code 002995 so that we receive your information. The U.S. Department of Education will determine your estimated family contribution (EFC) using the information supplied on the FAFSA. The FAFSA can be completed online at fafsa.ed.gov.

You may submit the FAFSA after October 1, for the following year. The priority deadline to apply for Student Aid is April 15. Financial Aid award notices are mailed in late-May or early-June.

Fall Housing Information

If you are an unmarried freshman, under the age of 21 years, and will not be living at a parent or legal guardian's permanent home, you are required to complete a housing contract.

DCB offers a discounted shuttle service on Thursday, August 22, 2019 for first-year students. This service runs to the Minot airport/train station. 
