“9-over-12” Pay Program

You are eligible to participate in Minot State University’s “9-over-12” pay program because you have accepted a 9, 9.5, or 10 month contract as a benefited faculty member.

Following the normal pay process for a 9 month contract, you will receive the contracted salary amount over 18 pay dates from September 15th through May 31st. Pay dates are semi-monthly; twice each month on the 15th and last working day of the month. (Contracts for 9.5 or 10 months are paid in a similar manner.)

You have the option of being paid over a 12 month period. If you choose to participate in the 9-over-12 pay program, you agree to the receipt of the contracted salary over 24 pay dates from September 15th through August 31st. Pay dates remain semi-monthly.

If you choose to participate in the 9-over-12 program, your choice will be automatically renewed each year unless you notify us of a different choice at the beginning of the next contract.

If you choose to receive your contracted salary through the normal pay process over 18 pay dates, or *if you are a current participant in the 9-over-12 program and do not desire a change, you don’t need to do anything with the form below.*

If you are a current participant and choose to opt out of the program, please complete the form below by initialing the second choice and return it with your signed contract.
