The LEAP Program

The LEAP (Leading to Education and Advanced Preparation) program is available to dual credit/early entry high school students. Students must have approval from their high school administrator. By completing the LEAP program, students will receive a Certificate in College Studies alongside their high school diploma.

Benefits

- **Time Savings** — Students can save a year of college coursework
- **Cost Savings** — Discounted tuition rate
- **Flexible Delivery** — Students can take this program completely online or through a combination of online, face-to-face, and ITV delivery
- **Transferability** — The general education courses in this program will transfer to other colleges in the North Dakota University System
- **College Advisor** — Assistance in developing individualized academic plan
- **Scholarship Opportunities** — NDUS Dual Credit Scholarship (available to students that have graduated high school, completed at least one dual credit course in high school, are enrolled in a qualified ND institution of higher education, and have completed one semester.)

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
