The State Board of Higher Education (SBHE) met last week on Friday afternoon and they accepted an early retirement for

Chancellor Hagerott. His last day as leader of the North Dakota University System (NDUS) was to be December 31, 2025 – but at his request, that date has been accelerated to April 29, 2025. This transition necessitates the naming of an interim Chancellor as soon

as possible, and SBHE will begin meeting today to determine the next steps for NDUS. Please join me in thanking Chancellor Hagerott for his ten years of leadership. We certainly wish him well in his next venture, which he said will be in support of national security efforts for the United States Navy.

We are still waiting for continuing news on the NDUS budget. Details of the House version of SB

2003 – the NDUS budget bill – should be available this week. Assuming there are variances, the next steps would likely include a conference committee to work out any differences from the Senate version of the bill.

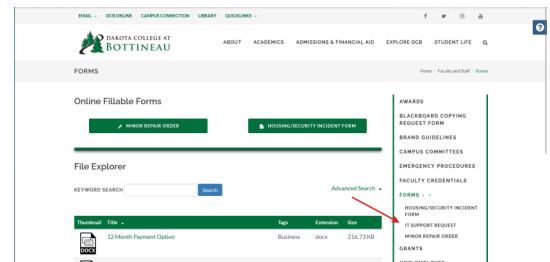
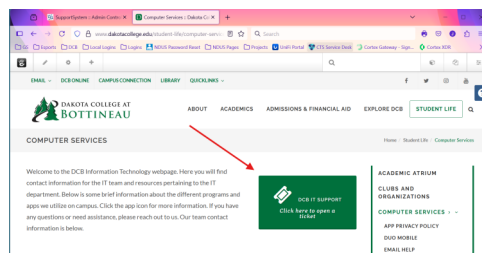
IT has implemented a ticketing system for IT Support Requests. Please use this system for better tracking and handling of IT service requests.

## NJCAA ANNOUNCES HONOREES

**March 6, 2025 Charlotte, NC** –The NJCAA has announced its first ever honorees for the Coaches Legacy Awards presented by Nufabrx, which recognizes the all-time win-



ningest coaches in NJCAA history. This is the first time in the near 90-year history of the NJCAA that coaches have been recognized in such a fashion by the Association.

Nearly 200 coaches across 28 different sports were nominated by the member colleges at which they coached.

"Being able to recognize our coaches, past and present, is a wonderful thing for the NJCAA, our member institutions, the coaches, and their families," said Dr. Christopher Parker, NJCAA President and CEO. special luncheon on Tuesday, June 17, in Charlotte, North Carolina, at the Hilton Charlotte University Place Hotel. The luncheon will precede the 2025 NJCAA Hall of Fame and Awards event, scheduled for later that day. Outreach has already begun for honorees and designees regarding attendance.

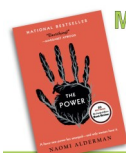
