- Enterprise Solutions Sup-

ports NDUS institutions' teaching, research, and service missions through tools like Microsoft Office 365, the enterprise learning management system, the NDUS help/service desk, and other collaborative technologies

- Infrastructure and Operations
 Manages NDUS's statewide IT infrastructure, including data centers, networks, server environments, storage solutions, and systems monitoring
- Identity and Access Management (IAM) Ensures secure and efficient access to system resources through authentication, provisioning, role-based access, and identity lifecycle management
- Information Security Provides risk management, cybersecurity operations, threat response, and policy enforcement to safeguard NDUS digital assets and ensure system resilience
- Institutional Data Reporting and Analytics Services – Drives institutional effectiveness through data reporting, governance, business intelligence, data warehouse development, and advanced analytics initiatives

LOGGER APPLAUSE

Thank you Kayla for your submission to the Workforce Education Innovation Fund (WEIF) Application in accordance with N.D.C.C. 15-10-75. The NDUS office received a total of 23 applications, with funding requests totaling \$13,099,500. We are told that the WEIF Committee met and engaged in extensive and thoughtful discussion around each of the submitted proposals. The committee greatly appreciated the creativity and innovation represented in the applications and commended the efforts to address critical workforce needs across North Dakota.

Although the legislative allocation being limited to \$10 million, the committee was not able to award the full amount requested for each project, DCB ended up with the most funding.

- Expanding Healthcare Training in Minot: Developing a Medical Laboratory Technician AAS Program
