WORKING PARENTS CHILD CARE RELIEF PROGRAM

Through Minot State University, DCB is participating in the ND Working Parents Child Care Relief benefit for employees. DCB employees may be eligible to receive a state match for childcare expenses through the North Dakota Working Parents Child Care Relief (WPCCR) program.

The application process for the Working Parents Child Care Relief (WPCCR) program administered through the State of ND Health and Human Services (HHS) division, is changing. Employees working at campuses within the North Dakota University System (NDUS). If you are interested in applying, you may do so, for the Working Parents

Child Care Relief (WPCCR) program.

What You Need to Do:

Go to the <u>HHS employee portal</u> and click on the Parents tab.

Click on the Participating Working Parents—First Time Working Parents application (unless you've applied prior)

Use the Minot State University employer code: ER-0001217 for application

Wait for eligibility confirmation and status updates from HHS.

Additional Information:

Payments for September WPCCR-eligible participants

will be processed and on the **October paycheck**.

To receive September payments, you must enroll by September 30th.

HR/Payroll will provide confirmation and further communication once your application has been reviewed and approved.

Benefitted employees who meet the above criteria are eligible to participate. Part-time and temporary employees may also be eligible, based on a consistent work schedule of 20 or more hours per week that is expected to cover 20 or more weeks in a year.

RANKED IN TOP 3 BEST NURSING SCHOOLS IN ND



As part Dakota College at Bottineau (DCB) has been ranked among the top three nursing schools in

North Dakota by *RegisteredNurs-ing.org*, a resource that supports current and prospective nurses with educational and career guidance.

This recognition places DCB as the highest-ranked two-year institution on the list, with only four-year universities ranking higher—underscoring the exceptional quality and performance of DCB's nursing program within the state.

DCB's nursing program is part of the Dakota Nursing Program, a consortium of ND community colleges offering a curriculum for both a Practical Nursing Certification and an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing. These programs provide students with hands-on clinical experience and the opportunity to complete their training in as little as one year, enabling a faster transition into the healthcare workforce.

Graduates of the Practical Nursing Certificate program are eligible to take the NCLEX-PN and apply for licensure as Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs). Many students go on to complete the AAS in Nursing, which qualifies them to take the NCLEX-RN and pursue licensure as Registered Nurses (RNs). Paige Baade, Assistant Dean for Nursing & Health Professions, "This recognition affirms the dedication of our faculty, students, and clinical partners. Dakota College at

Bottineau is proud to be shaping the next generation of nurses who are ready to lead, serve, and strengthen healthcare across our state. It is incredibly rewarding to see our mission come to life through this recognition."

At a time when North Dakota is facing a critical shortage of qualified healthcare professionals, DCB is helping to meet this demand by graduating more than fifty nursing students annually. These graduates consistently demonstrate excellence, with a 100% NCLEX pass rate in the 2023-2024 reporting cycle.

DCB remains committed to providing accessible, high-quality nursing education that prepares students to serve and strengthen healthcare systems across the state.
