NDPERS ANNUAL ENROLLMENT

2026 NDPERS Annual Enroll-

ment period begins on Monday, October 20.

During Annual Enrollment, eligible employees have the opportunity to review and make benefit options for the upcoming plan year (Jan 2026-Dec 2026). On October 20, employees must complete their benefit elections on Member Self Service (MSS). The only exception is the Voya Life Insurance Evidence of Insurability (EOI), which will follow a separate process. Detailed instructions will be provided in the Employer Guide next week.

Employees are responsible for submitting any required forms to Sandy H (HR Rep) or Jen M (Payroll Rep). These forms are forwarded to the NDPERS office at least once per week during Annual Enrollment.

NDPERS offers multiple options for submitting forms to ensure timely processing.

All enrollment selections and any re-

quired printed forms must be submitted no later than Friday, Nov 7.

LOGGER APPLAUSE


