SUAS PRESENT IN WASHINGTON



Michelle, Jo Leader, and Linda Burbidge went to the Advanced Technological Education Conference (ATE) conference in Wash-

ington DC last week. The conference is for those who have been awarded National Science Foundation (NSF) Grant through the Advanced Technician Education (ATE) program.

They presented on the success of our Industry Bootcamp that was held at DCB last spring providing participants ideas on how to set up their own bootcamps.

They also set up a connects session which allowed them to network with other community colleges that are doing similar work.

This was the third year DCB was able to go under the current grant, which had a major goal of developing a stackable certificate program for sUAS to enhance technician education.

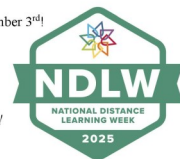

Through The Village [Employee Assistance Program \(EAP\)](#), you have access to completely free and confidential counseling sessions for a variety of emotional, relationship, or workplace concerns. A frequently used and convenient option is virtual counseling, which allows you to meet with a licensed Clinician from the comfort of your own space and on a schedule that works for you. All you need is a device with a camera, microphone, a private space, and internet connection. The number of sessions available is equal to the number of household members times 4.

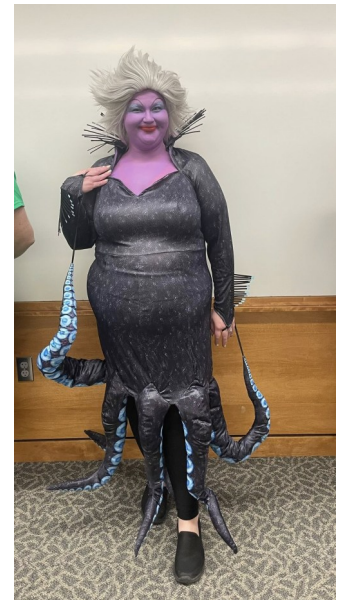
