PROGRESS CONTINUES-DCB SUAS DRONE PROGRAM



Dakota College at Bottineau (DCB) is making progress through the National Science Foundation ATE grant awarded in 2023 by the U.S. government's independent science agency. The three-year initiative is focused on strengthening the rural ND workforce by preparing highly skilled small unmanned aircraft system (sUAS) technicians through education and hands-on training.

Serving a rural population, DCB identified a growing need for qualified sUAS technicians. In response, DCB has prepared a stackable certification program in drone technology scheduled to start Spring 2025 semester. It is incorporated into two-year degrees in Natural Resources, Agriculture, Fish and Wildlife, and Business. These short-term, industry programs may be earned separately or in conjunction with other programs, eventually leading to a higher-level certificate or degree.

The NSF ATE program supports the education of technicians who work in high-tech fields that drive the nation's economy. Because two-year community and technical colleges are the leading sources of technician education in the US, faculty from these colleges have had leadership roles in most ATE funded projects. As part of the grant, DCB instructors Dr. Linda Burbidge, Michelle Cauley, and Jo Leader presented at the NSF-ATE PI Conference held in Washington, DC, this fall. This presentation will help other schools replicate

DCB's success in creating a bootcamp.

As part of the grant-supported efforts, DCB hosted an industry bootcamp in 2025, providing current professionals in agriculture, natural resources, and other related industries with experience in real-world applications using drones. Designed for success in three parts: online learning, handson flight training, and a postproject, participants are equipped with practical skills that can be used in their workplace. DCB's ATE initiatives continue to expand opportunities for rural learners and employers, reinforcing the college's commitment to innovation and workforce development in ND.

ROTH 457 OPTIONS COMING IN 2026

Big updates are coming to the NDPERS 457 Deferred Compensation Plan.

Starting in January 2026, you will have more flexibility in how to save for retirement, including the option to make after-tax Roth contributions.

Here's what's coming

Roth options vary depending on your NDPERS-authorized 457 provider – some providers may support all options, some only a few, and others may not offer Roth.

- Contribute after-tax Roth dollars to your NDPERS 457 Plan
- Convert existing pretax con-

tributions to Roth (after-tax)

- Roll in Roth contributions from other plans to your NDPERS 457 Plan
- Take advantage of "super catch-up contributions" when you reach ages 60 to 63 (IRS regulations apply to Highly Compensated Employees) * Understand mandatory Roth catch-up provisions for Highly Compensated Employees effective January 2026.

Conservation Award Nominations



DIGITAL ACCESSIBILITY UPDATE

Significant changes to federal digital accessibility standards are coming, which will impact how we create and share digital content across campus. Areas affected include, but are not limited to:

- College websites (dakotacollege.edu and dcbjacks.com)
- Blackboard courses and social media platforms along with mobile applications and email communications

Under these new regulations, all digital documents must comply with <u>Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)</u>. Additionally, media such as video and audio will be subject to updated accessibility requirements. Public institutions must be fully compliant by **April 24, 2026**. To prepare for these changes, DCB has established a Digital Accessibility Committee. This committee is working to develop strategies and resources to help ensure both new and existing content meets accessibility standards efficiently and effectively. Further guidance and training opportunities will be coming soon. In the meantime, if you have questions or would like to learn more, please reach out to Jacob Nelson in IT.
