CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION: The course helps learners to gain the knowledge and skills to install, configure, customize, optimize, and troubleshoot the Microsoft Windows operating system in a stand-alone and network environment.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The course focuses on teaching configuration tasks performed on the client computer by a desktop administrator in a business environment. This course prepares students for the TestOut Client Pro certification exam.

Students will have to Download VirtualBox for implementation of a virtual environment to implement virtual machines for labs.
