

## FALL 2026 DENTAL ASSISTING APPLICATION ASSESSMENT

Applicants for the Dental Assisting program will be assigned points for the criteria listed below to determine which applicants will be accepted. The 12 applicants who have the most points will be selected for admission into the Dental Assisting program. To receive points for the courses, applicants must have completed the courses and received a letter grade by the end of Fall Semester 2025. All science courses must be completed within the last seven years to be eligible for points. If a course is retaken, the most recent grade will be accepted. Students must also take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS-Version 7 by Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) and submit verification of dental practice observations by March 15, 2026.

Applicants may apply before all of the prerequisite courses are completed but should be registered for them during spring semester prior to being admitted.
