CTE month celebrates programs across North Dakota that gain the academic, technical, and employability skills necessary for career readiness.

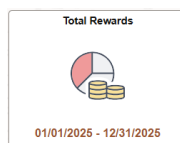
Harlie Huschka, Freshman enrolled in the Horticulture program, is more than satisfied

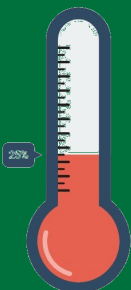

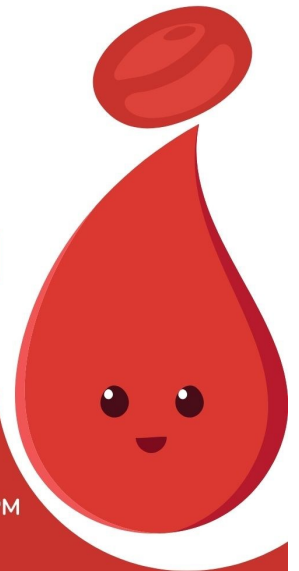
