f. Chancellor's Cabinet / Dean's Update	Migler	Chancellor's Cabinet agenda reviewed. Executive order has been put in place to authorize all NDUS campuses to be closed on December 24 th . Employees shall be granted paid leave to be used. The Family Friday (closed the day after Thanksgiving) was not approved for this year, with the focus on getting the 4% salary increase this year. Family Friday request may be reconsidered next year. Legislative management letter identifies that the Interim Higher Ed Committee has concluded their work for the year. Three motions were approved: 1) Implementation of a direct admissions program 2) Determined that SAM retention data to be more useful than IPEDS. SAM data be used for retention rates. 3) Review distance ed programs on a system wide perspective Stage 1 of the Ag program proposal was approved. Higher Ed Governance Task Force is considering a recommendation to have multiple boards. Any change in board governance would have to go to a vote by the citizens.
