

ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE Business Education

This degree is designed for the student planning to transfer to a four year baccalaureate degree program and complete the requirements to teach at the secondary level.

Why study business education?

Graduating with a degree that leads to employment is important to your future. The Associate of Science (AS) in Business Education program will prepare you to transfer to a four-year program where you will complete your business education degree.

Business education teachers prepare middle and high school students for careers in business through hands-on exercises and experience. As a business education teacher you will write lesson plans, grade assignments and tests, and advise student organizations.

Teaching is both rewarding and challenging. As a business education or marketing education teacher, you can expect to work regular school hours. You will also likely work some nights and weekends, preparing lesson plans, grading assignments and tests, and advising student organizations.

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
