Requirements for the Associate of Arts degree in History requires completion of the following classes: World Civilization, United States History, North Dakota History, World Regional Geography, History of Rock and Roll and International Politics/American Government. Graduates will leave with the critical thinking skills necessary to use primary source documents to construct thesis based written work.

Graduates with an AA in History will have earned the marketable skills that can lead to a variety of future academic paths and career options. Historical inquiry allows for a better understanding of human social systems in several different fields. Of course, many students of history desire to explore the world of teaching history or social studies, and this is a great first step. 
